Nick entered the program in need of stable housing, supportive care to address his mental health, and substance abuse programming. A father of four, his mission and motivation was clear: to reunite with his family in order to be able to provide for them on a full-time basis. A very humble, polite individual, he surrendered completely to the process of working his 12-Step Program. In doing so, he secured not one, but two jobs, began saving money by opening two bank accounts, and eventually moved into stable, affordable housing with his girlfriend.

"Peter"

Peter entered the program after a referral from a substance abuse/mental health facility. His story is very unique as he had been homeless and living in the woods for 20 years! When he arrived, he was very guarded but willing. Eventually he softened and the latter paid off as he secured a sponsor, engaged in the in-house programming, and regularly attended AA meetings as he continued his step work. He went on to secure full-time work but due to the physical demands of the job and a few minor health issues, he had to resign. The employer was so impressed with his tenacity the they held his position and eventually that opened the door to a full-time position with another company with better pay and benefits. He managed to open a bank account and through strict budgeting, he saved enough money to seamlessly transition into an Oxford House.
